



Code Red HEAT ALERT

Extreme heat events are the most dangerous weather hazard in the United States contributing to an average of more than 600 reported deaths per year.

Alerts

During days of extreme heat, the Baltimore City Health Commissioner will announce a Code Red Extreme Heat Alert.

Who is at-risk?

People who are living alone, mentally impaired, unable to travel, poor, experiencing homelessness, older adults, infants or those reluctant to leave pets behind are most at-risk during an extreme heat event.

When there is a Code Red Extreme Heat Alert, the City of Baltimore will open Cooling Centers to provide relief from the heat. Cooling Centers have air-conditioning and offer shade and cold water for residents.

Transportation

If you are a senior in need of transportation to a local cooling center, accommodations can be made through CARE's Taxi Card voucher program. Prior registration is required. See <http://www.caretaxicard.com/>.

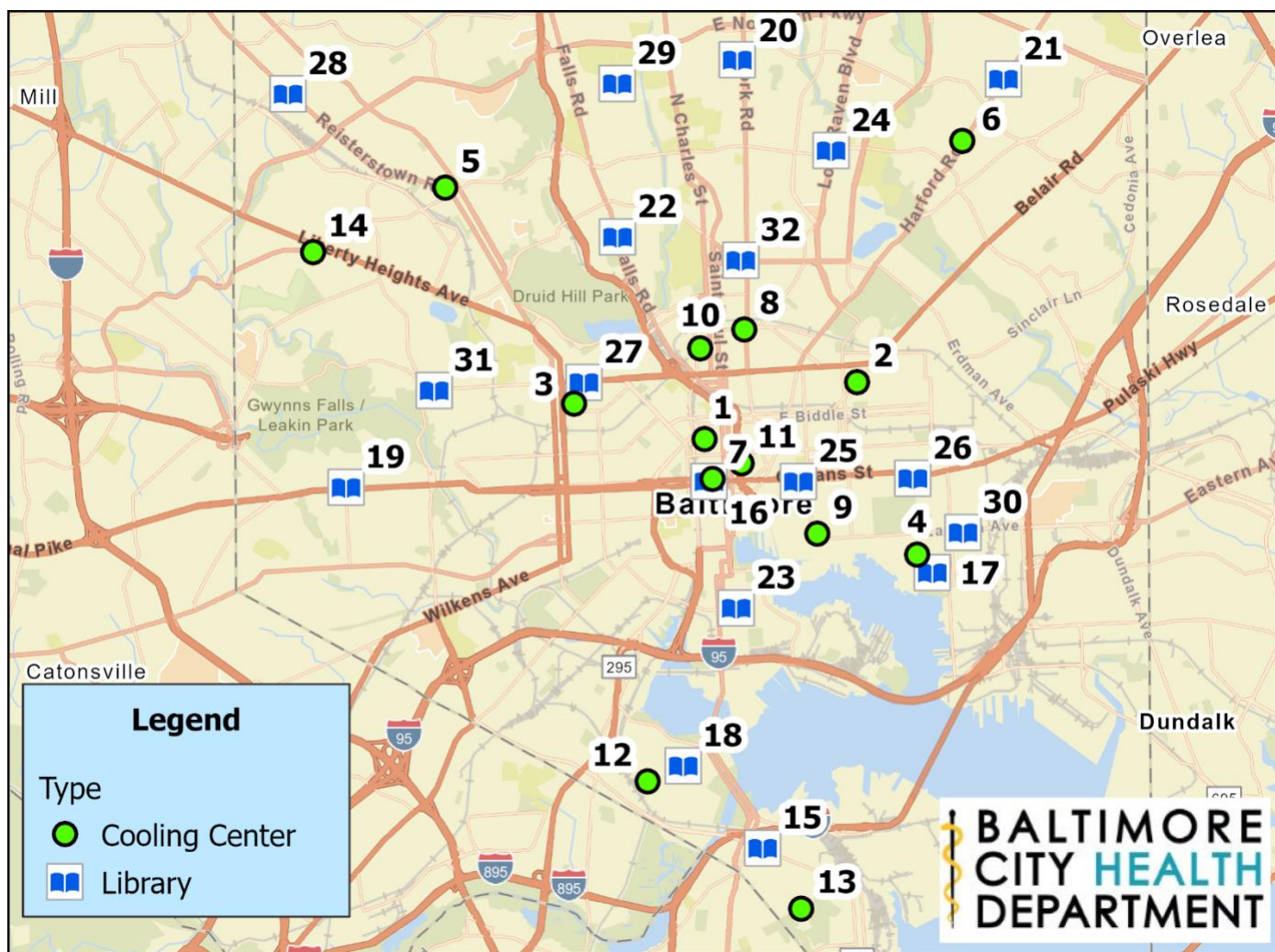
